

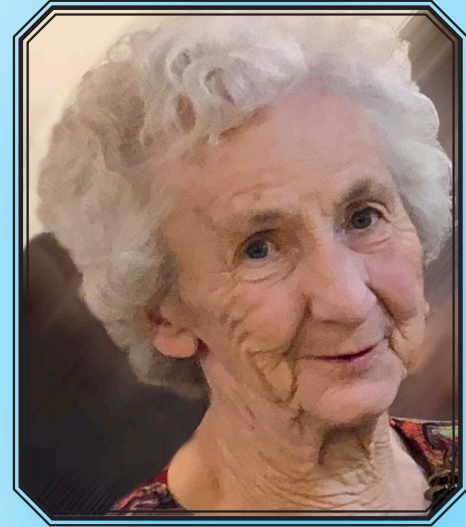
God looked around His garden
